All proceeds from the event will benefit The Hemispherectomy Foundation, a non-profit organization dedicated to providing emotional, financial and educational support for individuals and their families who have undergone or will undergo a hemispherectomy, or similar brain surgery.

Early registration ends May 9. The pre-registration cost for adults is \$25 and \$30 on the day of the race. 
# The Hemi Foundation Needs YOU !


