men, from Darien, Connecticut, came together in mid-March, to show their support for a little girl named Grace Wohlberg, a 5th Grader from their home town. Grace had just undergone a right hemispherectomy, for Rasmussen's Encephalitis, and her brother Michael and coach Rob Trifone, of the Blue Wave football team, and the entire community of Darien came together to make a difference. And boy did they make a difference! In two days, they raised over \$18,000 for The Hemispherectomy Foundation!



The event, "Lifting Grace", was a lift-a-thon where athletes request people to sponsor them per pound. Each athlete makes three lifts, and then adds up the total weight of each lift. Each Athlete will lift almost 1000 pounds and some MORE!
